

Off Road Path/Trail Assessment (2018)

*The higher the point value, the higher the quality of the trail and vice versa the lower the point value, the lower quality of the trail.

Rating	Water/Drainage	Vegetation/Clearances	Pavement Condition	Signage/Pavement Markings	Comments/Details/Explanations
1 (Very Poor)	Significant standing water on the path following rainfall	Encroaching vegetation poses safety risk to bike riders	Significant faulting, cracking, or heaving; ride quality is uncomfortable	No signage, tactile mats, or markings along the trail	
2 (Poor)	Slight standing water along the trail, with spots of significant standing water in certain areas along the path	No clearance on either side of path, and slight overhanging vegetation	Advanced pavement degradation	One or two signs along the entire trail, little to no markings, and tactile mats are few if any	
3 (Average)	Random ponding at points on the trail, but mainly clear after rainfall	At least a half a foot of clearance on either side of path, no overhanging vegetation	Cracks are common; some vertical heaving may be evident	Signage is scattered throughout the trail and the intersections are marked, however it may need to be remarked or signage replaced	
4 (Good)	Slight wet areas near the sides of the path, however mainly clear	At least one foot of clearance on each side of path and no overhanging vegetation	Some low severity longitudinal or transverse cracking	Signage is clear as well as markings, and ADA ramps and mats are at all main intersections, however may not be at every crossing along the trail	
5 (Excellent)	No ponding or standing water immediately after significant rainfall	At least two feet of clearance on each side of path and no overhanging vegetation	Smooth, level, and unbroken	Street crossings clearly marked; ADA accessible ramps and tactile mats at all intersections
